MONDAY, MARCH 11, 2019 @ 7:30 pm CHASING COLOR: MINING BOULDER OPAL **IN AUSTRALIA**

During their year-long "walkabout," Geologists Dick and Mary Pat Weber visited most of the opal mining districts in Australia. On this "walkabout" trip, the Webers put 143,000 km on a brand new Toyota Camry.

Their favorite area was the boulder opal deposits in the channel country of Queensland. The miners there live under primitive and hazardous conditions in a remote area of the Outback. where there are more snakes, lizards, and kangaroos than people.

Unique to the region, this opal is found in massive ironstone concretions of the Cretaceous age. Through the generosity of their friends at Broken River Mining, join us and learn how this material is mined and processed to bring the world's most beautiful opal to market.

Dick and Mary Pat Weber are retired exploration geologists who have worked and traveled extensively throughout North America,

Australia and New Zealand. During these travels they have been granted special access to many mines, mineral deposits, and unique geologic areas.

Along with active participation in local gem & mineral clubs, they have been avid agate and mineral collectors for more than 20 years.



SHOP REPORT

FINAL POLISH WHEELS

When using the final polish leather wheels on the arbors in the front of the shop, only polish pieces with rounded corners and edges. We just had yet another skin torn by someone attempting to polish a piece with sharp corners. The leather skins we use are expensive, so if we in the future find that a member damaged a skin by having sharp edges or corners on their piece, we will ask that member to reimburse the Club for the cost of a new skin.

TRIM SAWS

Trim saws should not be used for thick stones that easily can be cut in one of the bigger saws. The blades in the trim saws are much thinner than those in the 16" and 18" saws and will be "used up" much faster if used for large pieces. The largest size should not be more than a closed fist.

Robert Brownlee not only changed the faceplate on the number 1 trim saw (closest to the main room,) he also changed the oil feed to go directly into the bottom chamber where it wets the blade and like the smaller number 2 saw, does not have any adjusment for oil flow. Before you start any of the three trim saws, look at the oil level in the bucket with the pumps (between the trim saws and 18" saw, closest to the wall.) If the pumps are not covered with oil, more must be added.

GENERAL NOTES

Remember to clean the equipment you have been using when you are done.
